One of the bulls that had a huge impact on the Hereford cattle business in the 1960's was Golden Aster 068. This bull, owned by Harold Harms at Valentine, was Dr. Lance Jones' pick as the one bull that shaped many breeding programs throughout the Sandhills and Nebraska in the middle of the twentieth century. The story is told that Harold Harms purchased him in Chicago, then transported him back to the ranch in the back of a Studebaker pickup. The bull was two years old at the time, and the truck was at quite an angle when it pulled into the yard.

Golden Aster 068 was bred and raised by the Johnson Hereford Farm at Milford, Iowa, and was sired by Golden Aster 123. The Golden Aster family was popular when dwarfism was running rampant in many cattle families during the 1950's, and the Johnson bred cattle were considered "clean pedigreed".
